

ABSTRACT: The study's goal was to create and evaluate a Paclitaxel medication delivery system using solid lipid nanoparticles (SLN). Ofeic acid and soy lecithin were lipid and surfactant components of the SLN (Tween 80). The several batches of solid lipid nanoparticles containing paclitaxel were made utilizing various dosages of the drug and lipid, solvent emulsification by ultrasonication, and size reduction techniques. Excipients were used in experiments where the ratios of surfactants, lipids, and drugs were changed to improve the formulation properties. Drug content, in-vitro drug release, particle size analysis, scanning electron microscopy, Fourier transform-infrared investigations, scanning calorimetry, and stability have all been assessed for the developed formulations.

However, mortality has dropped in the last two years due to improved diagnostic tools and therapies andstanding of tumor biology. Currently available cancer therapies include surgery, radiation, and chemotherapeutic medications, many of which also cause the patient's healthy cells to die. Therefore, the creation of chemotherapeutics that can either passively or actively target malignant cells would be preferable. Passive targeting takes advantage of the biological characteristics of tumorsthat cause nanocarriers to build up inside of tumours due to the increased permeability and retention (EPR) effect [1].

Nanoparticles employed as drug delivery vehicles typically have a diameter of less than 100 nanometers in at least one dimension and are made up of biodegradable components such as natural or synthetic polymers, lipids, or metals. Because nanoparticles are more efficiently absorbed by cells than bigger micro molecules, they could be used as effective transport and delivery systems. Drugs can be integrated into the particle matrix or affixed to the particle surface for therapeutic purposes. The fate of a medicine entering the biological environment should be controlled by a drug targeting system. For medication and gene delivery applications, nano systems with various compositions and biological features have been widely explored [2].

Nanoparticles can increase intracellular concentration of medications in cancer cells while avoiding harm in normal cells utilising passive and active targeting techniques. Furthermore, when nanoparticles bind to certain receptors and enter the cell, they are frequently wrapped by endosomes via receptor-mediated endocytosis, bypassing P-glycoprotein recognition, which is one of the most common drug resistance mechanisms. Although nanoparticles have several advantages as drug carrier systems, they still have a number of drawbacks to overcome, including low oral bioavailability, circulatory instability, insufficient tissue distribution, and toxicity

Nanoparticles, according to the NNI (National Nanotechnology Initiative), are structures with at least one dimension ranging from 1 to 100 nm. The prefix "nano" is widely used for particles with a size of up to a few hundred nano meters. Nanocarriers with optimized physicochemical and biological properties are more easily taken up by cells than bigger molecules, making them viable delivery methods for currently known bioactive chemiculs. EVALUATION OF ANTIPYRETIC AND ANTIULCER ACTIVITY OF ETHANOLIC EXTRACT OF LEAVES OF ALSTONIA SCHOLARIS L. IN ALBINO WISTAR RATS

ABSTRACT

Objective: The purpose of the present study was aimed at evaluating the antipyretic and antiulizer activity on leaves of Alstonia scholaris L. (Family Apocynaceae) on albino Wistar rats. The antipyretic and antiulizer activity of the ethanolic system of the A. scholaris L. leaves in three different concentrations (50, 100, and 200 mg/kg) were compared with standard paracetamol and pantoprazole, which was evaluated by employing brewer's yeast-induced pyrena and ethanol-induced ulcer model. The biochemical parameters such as the volume of gastric juice secretion, pH, total acidity, ulcer index, percentage protection, and lipid peroxidation (LPO) were also studied.

Methods: A scholar's leaves were extracted with ethanol by Soxhlet extraction method. The dried extract was used for further phytochemical and pharmacological analysis. The antipyretic effect was studied using brewer's yeast-induced pyrexia. The ethanol-induced ulcer model was used to study the antiplicer effect.

Results: The percentage yield of ethanolic extract of A. scholaris leaves was 15.61% w/w, respectively. The extract showed significant antipyretic and antiplicer affects when compared with standard paracetamol and pantoprazole.

Conclusion: The ethanolic extract of A. scholaris has significant antipyretic and antiulcar activity.

INTRODUCTION

Peptic ulcers are one of the most common gastrointestinal diseases and widespread global problem in modern era arise due to various factors [1,2]. The pathophysiology of peptic ulcer disease has centered on an imbalance between aggressive and protective factors in the stomach [3]. The peptic ulcer is characterized by an area of the gastrointestinal tract which has been damaged by gastric acid or peptin [4]. Lifestyle and diseasy changes are the most prominent causes of peptic ulcer and related acid peptic disease [5]. The exploding occurrence of peptic ulcer in the first half of 20° century in the medical scene led to recommend it as an epidemiological illness, which was followed by a reducing range of incidence and finally vanished as a surgical medicinal condition. The reason for this decline is due to more effective acid suppression drugs such as H_a receptor blockers, proton pump inhibitor, and recognition of Helicebocter pilori [4].

As a result, more and more drugs, both herbal and synthetic are coming up presenting newer and better options for the treatment of peptic ulcer [7]. Alatonic acholoris L. belongs to the family Apocynaceae as shown in Pigs 1 and 2, found to be widely distributed throughout tropical regions of sub-Himalayan belt. West Bengal, Bihar, peninsular India, and Southeast Asia. The shrub is commonly known as "Saptaparni" or the "Devil tree." It is one of the most versatile medicinal plants as well as in pharmacologically as a traditional medicine [8]. It is used in the treatment of antiarthritic [9], anticomulsant [10], antibacterial [11], antidiabetic [12], anti-inflammatory [13]. antionidant [14,15], antimicrobial [16], ameliorative [17], bronchodialatory [18], and hepatogrotective [19].

METHODS

Antmal

Male albino Wister rats (180-720 g) were used for the study. The animals were obtained from CPCSEA approved institute Bharat Serums and

Vaccines Limited, Thane West, Maharashtra 400604. The use of these animals and the study protocols were approved by CPCSEA recognized institutional Animal Ethics Committee of Oriental College of Pharmacy under protocol no. 0CP/IAEC/2018-19/04 titled "to evaluate antipyretic, and antiulcer activity of A scholoris L. in albino Wister rats." Thesis entriled "evaluation of anti-ulcer activity of selected herbal plant." Pats were kept at the animal house of Oriental College of Pharmacy, Sanpada, Nam Number; in polypropyliene cages, at 2242°C, with 12:12 h dark light cycle. They were provided with commercial rat feed and water given of libitum.

Drugs and chemicals

Paracetamol and pantoprazole were obtained from Cipla Ltd., and ethanol was obtained from Thomas Baker Chemicals, Brewer's yeast powder (Now Foods). All other chemicals used in this study were obtained commercially and were of analytical grade.

Plant material

The fresh leaves of A. scholaris L. were collected from near Seawoods station, Seawoods West, Mumbai, in October 2017 and were submitted to Dr. Rajendra D. Shinde, Director, Blatter Herbanium of St. Xavier's College, Mumbai. The leaves were compared and authenticated by comparison with the Blatter Herbanium Specimen No. NI-1417 of N.A. Irani.

Qualitative phytochemical screening

Preliminary chemical tests were carried out on the ethanolic extract of A scholaris L for determination of the presence of different phytoconstituents. All tests were performed by the procedures given in Practical Pharmacognosy' by Dr. K. R. Khandelwal [20]. The result was shown in Tables 1 and 2.

Selection of doses

In interature survey, it was found that the ethanolic extract of A scholaris L. was safe LD_{2a} of the ethanolic extract is reported to be 2000 mg/kg [21]. The plant is often eaten by animals, which is also an indicator to prove

An industry-institute interaction activity was successfully organized as a part of IQAC.



OCP ANIMAL HOUSE Reg. No. 1464/PO/Re/S/11/CPCSEA

Oriental College of Pharmacy, has developed the state-of- the-art animal facility to conduct preclinical experiments using various animals like Mice, Rats, Guinea Pig, Rabbits. The facility has been constructed in accordance with the Committee for the Control and Supervision of Experiments on Animals (CCSEA) guidelines and is registered (Reg. No. 1464/PO/Re/S/11/CPCSEA) for experiments on animals under CCSEA, Ministry of Environment & Forests (Animal Welfare Division), Government of India.

The air-conditioned facility is located on 2nd floor of college and has a total built up area of about 60 square meters. Various functional areas like a separate Quarantine area, store room, wash area, animal housing areas and experimental/dosage area are present. Facility for housing different species in different rooms is available. Experimentation area is equipped with instruments required for surgery and euthanasia.

- Washing facilities and sanitation conditions: Required washing facilities and sanitation conditions are maintained as per guidelines. Cages are washed in separate wash area. To maintain personnel hygiene, the autoclaved aprons, disposable masks, disposable foot covers and disposable caps are available. Floor and walls are cleaned with disinfectant routinely.
- Disposal of animals after experimentation as per norms: SOP is in place for Disposal of animals after experimentation. Institute has outsourced services of Mumbai Waste management as per bio medical waste (M&H) as per the Rules & Guidelines-MPCB for the disposal of bio medical waste.
- Air conditioning/handling/circulation/facilities: There are two air conditioners fitted in the facility

At our animal house we have successfully completed projects (preclinical experiments) for some industries in collaborative research practice. Very routinely our animal house is utilized for M. Pharm research projects of our students.




Glimpses of Day 3

An industrial visit of First year M. Pharmacy students of Oriental College of Pharmacy to Padmaja Aerobiologicals Pvt. Ltd. (PAPL), Turbhe on 9th March 2021.PAPL was established in the year 1983. Initially it started as a support laboratory to cater the needs of small as well as medium industries situated in Thane-Belapur. Subsequently it was re-engineered to a well-established analytical public testing / referee laboratory in the field of Environmental Monitoring. Work place monitoring, Drugs and Intermediates, Microbiological, Industrial Chemical etc. PAPL has been serving various customers for more than 30 years.

All branches of M. Pharmacy students were involved in the visit. Firstly, students of branches Pharmaceutics and Quality Assurance paid a visit to the organization from 11am to 1pm, followed by Pharmacology branch, from 2pm to 4pm. The morning batch was assisted by respected Principal, Dr. (Mrs.) Sudha Rathod and Dr. (Mrs.) Vandana Jain. The afternoon batch was guided by Dr. (Mrs.) Vanita Kanase. Eleven students of Pharmaceutics branch and Thirteen students from the Quality Assurance branch were present in the first slot. Fourteen pharmacology students were present in the second slot.


The visit comprised of students being given thorough exposure of High Performance Liquid Chromatography (HPLC) and Gas Chromatography (GC) application, working, instrumentation. Students were shown different types of columns used like C18, C8, etc. in HPLC and also how membrane filters look like. HPLC used was manual Shimadzu 17052 and the software used was Lab solutions, real time analysis. Also demonstration of sample loading was shown. Everything about troubleshooting to cleaning and maintenance was explained. The GC was connected to a Mass Spectrophotometer and also to a Head space. Sample injection was either by manual or by an Autosampler. GC used was of Agilent Technologies and the software used was GC. Different types of columns were shown like capillary column and cap column. Live demonstration of Air monitoring using charcoal was also shown.



3. The faculty accompanying the students must gather all relevant information about the visit including modes of communication at the remote location's hotels, visit sites as we all as the complete itenerary before the commencement of the trip. This information shall be communication to the institute office in advance of the trip.

All faculty including the institute head should share the hotel rooms with other faculty.

 The faculty accompanying the students must keep in mind that the visit is not a picnic but an important and valuable component of a student's academic studies. Hence, they must guide and advise students that enables them to obtain maximum academic benefits from the visit.

 The accompanying faculty must share information about the institute through brochures and dialogue with available officials of the Industry/Organisation. They must invite the industry personnel to visit our campus to give guest lectures. They should also encourage the HR department of the industrial site to visit the institute for campus placement.

 On return from the visit, the students should be asked to prepare a report on the visit and the faculty should grade these reports and assign marks that will be included in the final student

New Delhi, the 29th June, 2016

- No. F. 1-15-/2009 (ARC).—In exercise of powers conferred under clause (g) of sub-section (1) of section 26 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956), the University Grants Commission hereby makes the following regulations namely:—
 - These regulations may be called "Curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions (third amendment), Regulations, 2016."
 - (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publications in the Official Gazette.
 - In UGC Regulations on Curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 (herein-after referred to as the Principal regulations), in Para 3 the following shall be added after 3(i) under heading what constitutes Ragging.—
 - 3(j). Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.
