

GREY MATTERS

A short review on premature greying of hair

INTRODUCTION

Healthy hair signifies youth and well-being, while its purpose is debated. Hair is a non-verbal communication tool and aesthetic asset, and changes in colour and style can alter body image. Premature greying (PGH) affects self-esteem and occurs at different ages and racial group.1,2,3

Human hair colour varies from red to black, brown, and blonde. Melanocytes, which are specialized cells

that produce melanin pigment and transport it to neighbouring keratinocytes during the assembly of new hair fibres are responsible for the colour of hair. A reservoir of stem cells found in each hair follicle gives the organ the capacity to biologically renew and manufacture hair for the duration of its existence. Melanocyte stem cells (MeSCs) are closely related to hair follicle stem cells and are required to maintain the colour of the hair fibre by replenishing their differentiated, pigment-producing the next generations.4

Eumelanin and pheomelanin are two forms found in hair follicles. The amount and ratio of reddish-brown



pheomelanin and black-brown eumelanin influence hair colour. Hair phenotype is influenced by melanosome pH and cysteine content, with decreased tyrosinase activity causing increased pheomelanin and reddish or blonde hair.5

Research explores genes and signalling pathways influencing hair pigmentation, with Bmpr2 and Acvr2a receptors influencing hair colour, and reduced activity in mice potentially leading to early greying. Hair without pigment grows more quickly than hair with pigment. Grey hair is thicker, coarser, and more prone to weathering.

EPIDEMIOLOGY

According to a recent survey, 6-23% of adults have 50% grey hair by the time they are 50 years old. Dark-haired people detect greying more easily and early, although fair-haired people seem completely grey ahead of their time. The effects are similar for both sexes.6

ETIOPATHOLOGY

Most research has likely focused on the impact of reactive oxygen species (ROS) on hair greying. In the hair follicle, melanogenesis is active during the active growth phase. This results in significant cumulative oxidative stress due to the hydroxylation of tyrosine and the oxidation of dihydroxyphenylalanine to melanin. A decline in pigmentation might result from melanocyte damage caused by the antioxidant effect's failure.7

Another disorder that causes early greying of the hair is vitiligo. Vitiligo sufferers have melanocytes that are more vulnerable to oxidative stress. Damage from ROS to melanocytes causes differentiated melanocytes to undergo apoptosis and ectopic differentiation of stem cells.8 Reversible hypopigmentation of hair is linked to severe iron and copper deficits, chronic protein loss, and other malabsorption-related conditions like nephrosis, celiac disease, and kwashiorkor. Although clinical and empirical findings have shown that people with high levels of stress may accelerate or even cause hair greying, there is not enough experimental data to validate this hypothesis.9

MANAGEMENT

PABA, a potent inducer of melanocyte proliferation and melanogenesis, has been linked to temporary hair darkening in some individuals, while hair darkening has also been observed following prostaglandin, electron beam treatment, and X-ray irradiation.10

Amalaki (Emblica officinalis), Bhringaraj (Eclipta alba),



mooncake seed tree (Sterculia platanifolia), and lotus tree (Zizyphus spina-christi) are traditional remedies for darkening grey hair. Henna is a natural hair color that is derived from the leaves of the Lawsonia alba plant.11 Melitane is an alpha-MSH agonist and biomimetic peptide. It functions by binding the melanocortin 1 receptor, which in turn activates the hair's melanogenesis process. Another peptide that mimics alpha-MSH is palmitoyl tetrapeptide-20. Research has demonstrated its beneficial effects in reversing grey hair and boosting hair pigmentation.12

CONCLUSION

Premature greying of hair is a debilitating condition that affects social integration and acceptance. Future treatment strategies may focus on genes and proteins related to melanocyte biology in hair follicles, potentially leading to semi-synthetic, biotechnological, or natural hair re-pigmentation procedures. Further study into hair greying pathophysiology may provide insights into the aging process and potential intervention targets.

LIBRARY PIGHES




